#### FC 11.03 Grant of Overtime Allowance to PB-2 & PB-1 employees.

The remoteness of the Institute affects the functioning adversely, as trained and skilled manpower is not available, as a result, the work load of the regular employees gets enhanced. To cope up with the additional work load, the Group PB-2 & PB-1 employees are required to give extra time to complete the additional work load. There is a inevitable need to compensate these employees for their extra time devoted towards the efficient functioning of the Institution.

It is proposed to grant Overtime Allowance, as and when required by the Institute, to Group PB-2 & PB-1 employees who devote their personal time beyond the office hours and on weekends/holidays. The calculation for grant of Overtime Allowance is proposed as under:

#### FC 11.05 Approval for procuring Tractor Towed 5000 Ltr. Capacity Sewer Suction Machine.

The NIT Uttarakhand campus is located in the hilly area where no sewer lines are laid. Presently, sewage waste generated in the campus is being sucked and disposed at Sewage Treatment Plant of *Uttarakhand Jal Sansthan, Srinagar*.

Approximately an expenditure ₹8.50 lakhs per annum is incurred on hiring the Vacummed Sewage Collector Vehicle from Municipal Corporation of Srinagar Garhwal and the cost incurred towards payment of charges of Sewage Treatment Plant to Uttarakhand Jal Sansthan, Srinagar.

There is only one Vacummed Sewage Collector Vehicle with Municipal Corporation of Srinagar Garhwal, which if off road causes a severe handicap to the Institution. Also the capacity of Soak Pits is limited, and it is decreasing with the time, ultimately the sewage waste starts overflowing creating severe unhygienic conditions in the Campus.

To tide over the above stated problem, also keeping in mind the cost viability and negating the dependence on other agencies, it is proposed to procure Tractor Towed 5000 Ltr. Capacity Sewer Suction Machine at the cost of approximately ₹15.00 lakhs.

Finance Committee is requested to grant permission to procure Tractor Towed 5000 Ltr. Capacity Sewer Suction Machine for the Institute.

The annual subscription amount, as per the cadre of the employee, is deducted from the monthly salary of the respective employee. Presently there is no contribution from the Institute side towards the Group Insurance of the employee.

Institute is located in hilly terrain and employees have to travel frequently on the hill roads. Keeping in the view the tough location, risks involved and non-availability of requisite medical facilities, as a welfare measure for the employee of this Institution, it is proposed to enhance the Insurance cover by doubling the employee contribution along with a matching contribution by the Institute.

By making this provision the Insurance cover for each employee will be enhance to four times, which will be very beneficial for the employee and their families. To fulfill this obligation, as per present employee strength of the Institutes, the total annual Employer Contribution comes out to be Rs.1,44,858/- annually.

# REPORT OF THE CURRENT SITUATION REGARDING THE ALLOCATION OF ALTERNATIVE LAND AND CONSTRUCTION OF PERMANENT CAMPUS

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#### INTRODUCTION

National Institute of Technology Uttarakhand (NITUK) is one of the 31 National Institutes of Technologies in the Country. It was established in 2009 under the Act of Parliament by Ministry of Human Recourse Development. The Institute started its operations in Temporary Campus with 90 Under Graduate students, in July 2010. The present strength is 1250 in total including Under Graduate, Post Graduate and PhD Scholars.

Uttarakhand State Government is bound to allocate land for Permanent campus, free of cost, to NIT Uttarakhand as per MoU between Uttarakhand State Government and Central Government. 125.5 hectare (310 acres) of land in and around village Sumari, District Pauri Garhwal was allocated to NIT Uttarakhand on 9<sup>th</sup> December, 2013. The Permanent Campus site is located approximately 140km from Jolly Grant Airport, Dehradun and approximately 150 km from Haridwar Railway Station. The proposed site is located in the hills of Garhwal, Shivalik Range (Lower Himalayas), having M.S.L. varying from 1250 m to 950 m. Average slope of the terrain is 26<sup>0</sup>.

#### **AIM**

Aim of this paper is to present the facts and proceeding of allotment of land at village Sumari for construction of Permanent Campus of NIT Uttarakhand, cost incurred towards construction of Permanent Campus and a case for allotment of alternative land for the same.

#### **INSTITUTE CAMPUS**

#### **Temporary Campus**

The Institute is operational from its Temporary Campus since inception (07 Years). Temporary Campus is divided into two clusters namely Polytechnic Clusters and ITI Clusters.

#### Polytechnic Cluster

Six buildings have been taken on lease from the State Government Polytechnic. Also portion of available land has also made available for construction of additional buildings for NIT Uttarakhand. Two Pre-fabricated structures for the purpose of hostels have been constructed in the available land. Pre-fabricated structures have also been constructed on the roofs of the leased buildings to be used as Hostel, Classroom, Library and Sports Facility.

#### ITI Cluster:

 A portion of land was leased to NIT Uttarakhand nearby Government ITI, Srinagar for smooth functioning of Departmental Laboratories and

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Administration. In the calamity, occurred in June 2013, the Government ITI, Srinagar and nearby buildings was submerged by the silt deposits due to floods. On the silt deposits, three Pre-fabricated double story structures, having a total Plinth area of 6000sqm, were constructed by NIT Uttarakhand in June 2014.

- ii. Each department has plinth area of 1000 sqm which is not enough to accommodate Laboratory facilities for Under Graduate and Post Graduate Programme. Moreover, these structures which were constructed on silt deposits have constrain of installation of some necessary heavy Laboratory Equipment.
- iii. Presently, Institute does not have any facility for staff accommodation as well as the current hostel accommodation is insufficient for our requirements. There are two rented staff hostel, which can accommodate thirty staff members. Approximately 40% of the students are staying out of the Institute Campus.
- The Temporary Campus also have constraints of Library facility, Sports facility and other recreational facilities which are essential for all-round development of students and thus, the Institute has an inevitable requirement of a Permanent Campus.

#### Permanent Campus

NIT Uttarakhand was allotted 125.576 hectare (310 acres) of land for its Permanent Campus at village Sumari, District Pauri Garhwal. Out of this 125.576 hectare, 7.611 hectare is the land donated by the local people through the State Government which in turn was allotted to the Institute on 9<sup>th</sup> December, 2013.

The land provided for the campus is in the hilly terrain having level difference of 300m. i.e. lowest point at 950m and highest point at 1250m. The site is divided into two parts by a valley in between. Chronological summery of events and process of acceptance of the proposed site is as under:

Preliminary Geotechnical Survey Report on suitability of proposed site for construction of Campus which was carried out by Prof. M.N. Viladkar (Professor, Department of Civil Engineering IIT Roorkee), Prof. R. Anbalagan (Professor, Department of Earth Sciences, IIT Roorkee) and Prof. S.Y. Kulkarni (Professor, Department of Architecture and Planning, IIT Roorkee) was presented on **March 2012** and following are the key points:

- The area can be divided into three distinct segments- A, B and C. In the portion
  of Segment-A where the slope is very steep (>45), no construction is possible.
- II. Part of segment- B appears to be suitable for construction. However, the quantum of suitable area in the middle portion can be assessed only after detailed Geotechnical investigations.

- III. Only a part of Segment C i.e. 30% of total area, appears to be suitable for construction.
- IV. It was stated in the report, that it appears, from the Geotechnical stand point, that the site identified is not at all suitable for the construction of the campus. (Annexure-I)

After the above Geotechnical Report, instead of segment 'A', extra area, totaling 310 acres, in Segment 'B' and segment 'C' was allocated to make up for the non-contractible area.

A site Selection Committee was constituted by MHRD Govt. of India vide DO No. F.No.21-10/2010-TSIII dated 09/05/2013. Following are the key recommendations by the Committee:

- I. The major part of site is on the slopes of a hillock. Some part of the land includes valley on the northern side of hillock and slopes of another hill beyond the valley. Southern slopes of the hillock and slopes beyond valley on northern side are around and below 25° where construction is feasible. Western and northern slopes of the hillock are very steep and are not suitable for construction. The valley being on the northern side of steep slope lacks sunlight and ventilation and hence not suitable for construction. However, around 50 Hectare land is suitable for plantation, rainwater harvesting and solar farm.
- Road connection to Srinagar via NH 58 and NH 119 is disturbed during rainy season. But the road is maintained by BRO and is operational all the time except for occasionally few hours during rainy seasons.
- III. The proposed site is in earthquake prone area in Zone V and also the land is susceptible to land slide. Soil strength of the proposed land is poor and also there is a restriction on construction height and hence vertical expansion of construction of the Institute may be taken care of during preparation of Master Plan.
- IV. The construction being done on slopes will require extensive terracing and construction of retaining walls will be required.
- V. The altitude difference between lower area of campus and the upper area of camps being large (more than 150 m or equivalent to 50 stories of a building), a mechanized vertical transport system like inclined tram or mechanized elevators shall be essential.
- VI. The offered land is therefore, suitable for construction of Permanent Campus but with the above mentioned constrains.

Ministry of Human Resource Development accepted the report of the site Selection Committee vide letter no. F.21-10/2010.TS.III; dated 04/10/2013. (Annexure-II) 125.576 hectare (310 acre) land, out of which 7.611 hectare is donated by the villagers, was handed over to NIT Uttarakhand by State Govt.

vide letter no. 1196/XLI-1/2013-37/06, on dated 09/12/2013. (Annexure-III). After due scrutiny and approval from State Government, 125.576 hectare land has been transferred in the name of NIT Uttarakhand in the Land Records.

# PROCESS OF ALLOTMENT OF WORKS FOR CONSTRUCTION OF PERMANENT CAMPUS

- I. The Construction Agency was finalization after the due approval of BWC in its Second Meeting (Annexure-IV). NBCC limited was appointed as the Construction Agency for the Phase-I as per GFR amendment to rule 126 (2). Approval to start the work of master plan was also granted to the NBCC in the same meeting.
- II. DDF Consultant, as identified by NBCC, was appointed as Architectural Firm by the Board of Governors, NIT Uttarakhand.
- III. Approval of agency charges, construction of Boundary Wall, preparation of Master Plan and estimated cost was granted through a resolution in Third BWC meeting (Annexure-V) after the finalization of Construction Agency. The same was ratified in subsequent BoG. (Annexure-VI)
- IV. A detailed Sub Soil Investigation of the allotted site is attached as Annexure-VII. The report was non-conclusive and was presented in Third meeting of BWC.
- V. The master plan was prepared simultaneously so, as to increase the pace of developments on Permanent Campus.
- VI. The master plan was prepared for the suitable areas for construction as recommended by the Preliminary Geotechnical Report.
- VII. NBCC submitted the estimated cost of first phase of construction of permanent campus for 1500 students amounting to Rs. 315.75 Crore for Building Works and 188.26 Crore for Site Development and the same was approved in BWC (Annexure-V) and ratified by FC & BoG.
- VIII. Based on approved estimates, Work Order dated 04.03.2014 of 188 Crore for Site Development and Rs. 13.27 Crore for Boundary Wall construction was issued. A MoU was also signed between NBCC and NIT Uttarakhand. (Annexure-VIII)
  - IX. Committee of Experts from IIT Roorkee, along with representatives of NBCC and NIT Uttarakhand, visited the site and recommended following (Annexure-IX):
    - a. No permanent Boundary Wall shall be constructed until unless entire Site Development work is completed.
    - b. No construction of any building shall be undertaken unless the Site Development works in completed.
    - c. Similarly, no Geotechnical Investigations, from the point of view of design of foundations of various structures, shall be undertaken in the field unless the Site Development work for the whole campus is completed.

- d. On the basis of inspection of the material at the site, the Committee suggested to construct only Temporary Boundary Walls along the stretch of the Hills. Working drawings giving technical details of the Temporary Boundary walls was provided by IIT Roorkee.
- e. Terrace Development should proceed from higher elevation to lower levels.
- f. No terracing is involved in Zone located on the northern end of the complex (Drawing-NITSU/DDF/OVA/AR – 1000- Annexure-X) and hence construction of permanent Boundary Wall may be undertaken with immediate effect.
- X. NBCC executed the Temporary Boundary Wall construction and stated that it is difficult to construct permanent Boundary Wall in the area where no terracing is required due to inaccessibility as it is dense forest and steep terrain. (Annexure-XI)
- XI. NBCC estimated preliminary cost of site development as Rs. 188 Crore based on CPWD plinth area rate and the cost related to works for terracing was not taken into the account due to non-finalization of master plan and building blocks as the requirement and sizes of the buildings were not frozen at the time of estimate.
- XII. NBCC submitted revised estimate of 1200 Crore for terracing with Site Development and RCC retaining wall. (Annexure-XII)
- XIII. This alarming rise of cost on site preparation from 188 Crore to 1200 Crore forced NIT Uttarakhand to rethink on going ahead with the construction of Campus. However, against the work order for Site Development an advance of 1 Crore was paid to NBCC to cover the cost of survey, conceptual drawing, preliminary estimate on approval of concept drawings, environmental clearance etc.
- XIV. No bill has yet been submitted by NBCC to NIT Uttarakhand in spite of several reminders to NBCC from the Institutes (Annexure-XIII).

# THE CONSIDERATIONS OF CHANGE OF SITE FOR PERMANENT CAMPUS

The BoG was briefed about the construction activities at the Permanent Site and the members expressed their concern on the slow pace of progress. The BoG was informed that the mountainous terrain allotted for the campus posed serous hurdles to construction and that a 20m portion of the boundary fencing has collapsed in the recent landslide following rains. The BoG also was informed that owing to steep slope of the land and fragile terrains, the present estimate of the completed campus would cost about Rs. 1415 Crore including land leveling and soil stabilization cost of Rs. 925 Crore, an escalation to about 300%.

BoG resolved that the Ministry of Human Resources be appraised of the situation and be requested to allot the requisite funds. Given the high cost of the project, it was felt that the Ministry should also be approached for allotting a fresh parcel of land that is more suited for campus as an alternative.

It was further resolved that all the construction activities including compound wall should be suspended till clearance from MHRD. (Annexure-XIV)

The MHRD conducted a meeting of review committee on construction activities which was participated by NBCC, EdCIL, IIT Roorkee. The MHRD stipulated certain norms for construction of buildings at permanent campus. One of the stipulations state that "the master plan and design should be made without cutting the Himalayas" (Annexure-XV).

The Site Survey Report indicated the presence of natural debris on the permanent site till the depth beyond 04 meter. The expert from IIT Roorkee opined that a footing on natural debris is likely to be unsafe due to possibility of land sliding. They recommended building footings on the proper ground which can be exposed only after removing natural debris. (Annexure-VII)

The Board of Governors rejected the proposal of the Review Committee considering the discussions in previous Board meeting as well as expert opinion on the suitability of allotted site in view of terrain of land. Moreover, in the present location, safety of the lives and properly could be compromised considering the fact that the area is prone to landslides, earthquakes and cloudbursts. The Board decided that the Chairman with few members of the BoG should meet senior Bureaucrats in the MHRD to seek assistance in having new land to be allotted (Annexure-XVI)

The delegation of the BoG headed by Chairman BoG visited MHRD and appraised the Ministry for urgent requirement of change of present allotted site for permanent campus by allotting suitable fresh piece of land.

Hon'ble Minister of HRD, Smt. Smriti Zubin Irani wrote a letter to the Hon'ble Chief Minister Mr. Harish Rawat requesting allocation of fresh land for permanent campus. (Annexure-XVII)

The same was reiterated by Hon'ble Shri Prakash Javdekar, present Minister of HRD through a letter address to the Hon'ble Chief Minister, Mr. Harish Rawat. (Annexure-XVIII).

It is Evident from above that Present Site at village Sumari was rejected due to following reason:

- Exorbitant cost of construction of Permanent Campus is 1415 Crore which includes terracing and soil stabilization cost of 925 Crore.
- 2. The terrain characteristics wise steep slope of land and fragile strata.

3. The safety of life and property could be compromise considering that site is prone to landslide earthquake and cloud burst.

# REVISED DPR OF CONSTRUCTION OF PERMANENT CAMPUS AT VILLAGE SUMARI

As per instructions of MHRD all new NITs were directed to submit a revised DPR duly approved by BWC, FC & BoG. Therefore, a detailed Revised Project Report was prepared and approved in BWC but was not ratified in FC and consequently because institute has no constructible land.

The total cost of Phase-I construction as per this revised DPR is Rs. 2253.35 Crores (Rs. 1140.35 Crores for building works and Rs. 1113 Crore for site development) assuming strength as 2400 students.

# CURRENT STATUS ON ALTERNATE SITE FOR CONSTRUCTION OF PERMANENT CAMPUS

Consequent to the letters by the Ministry of Human Resources and Development to the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Uttarakhand, a meeting was held on 8th March, 2017 with Dr. Pankaj Kumar Pandey, Additional Secretary, Government of Uttarakhand. The meeting was attended by following Dignitaries: (Annexure-XIX)

- a. Mr. Amardeep, I/c Construction, NIT Uttarakhand.
- b. Mr. Lalit Mohan Bisht, Junior Engineer Civil Department, NIT Uttarakhand.
- c. Mr. Jagdeep Singh, Assistant Registrar, NIT Uttarakhand.
- d. Representative of District Administration.
- e. Representative of Principal G.B. Pant.

The meeting was non-conclusive and it was decided to hold another meeting with the State Authority.

Meanwhile Hon'ble Dhan Singh Rawat, Minister, Higher Education, Government of Uttarakhand, visited the Temporary Campus on dated 23<sup>rd</sup> May, 2017 to hold discussion on construction of Permanent Campus. Local Authorities, Journalist, and Representative from NIT Uttarakhand attended the discussion. Discussion ended with a clear cut directive to District Administration to look for possible construction site in and around Srinagar.

NIT and District Administrative jointly visited the following possible sites and Map and Contours of the same is attached as **Annexure-XX**:

- a. Bhugani.
- b. Datta Khet.
- c. Dhar Kot.

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- d. Janasu Arkani.
- e. Sampla and Khanda Tala.
- f. Sita Koti.

Based on the preliminary information available on the above site, willingness of the villagers and area of the Government land available. The land at and around Sitakoti village measuring to 123.451 hectare stands out in terms of sufficient land for construction of the permanent campus. Land comprises of three villages, namely Sitakoti, Muchiyali and Dhaulilaga Muchiyali, Joint visit of District Administration and NIT Uttarakhand was performed on 6<sup>th</sup> July, 2017. The outcome of the meeting is as following:

- a. Villagers are willing to offer the land through the State Government.
- Areas have been identified as; Napkhet (personal), Gochar (Reserved for cattle grazing) and Kasreen (Government) land.
- c. Detailed calculation of area is currently under progress with District Administration.
- d. The area is below 1000 m, so trees can be cut with permission of State Administration.

#### **Drawbacks of Proposed Site:**

- 1. As. The site is on Ganges Bank prior approval for construction of permanent nature is required from National Green Tribunal.
- The altitude difference between lower area of campus and the upper area of camps being large (more than 300 m or equivalent to 100 stories of a building), a mechanized vertical transport system like inclined tram or mechanized elevators shall be essential.
- 3. Proper geological as well as geotechnical survey must be done prior to land allotment to assess the estimated cost of construction.

It is evident from running account bills submitted by NBCC that the temporary steel fencing constructed at Sumari by NBCC cost Rs. 3,33,6705 Crores. Only running account bills is submitted by NBCC and even after few reminders no final bill has been yet presented to the Institute. Letters regarding foreclosure of the work and returning the unspent amount with interest has been sent several times.

#### FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS DUE TO CHANGE OF SITE

In case of change of site there will be requirement of Dismantling and reinstallation of temporary fencing at new site.

As per the understanding between forest department and NIT Uttarakhand, it is required to plant double number of trees that has been cut. Approximately 800 trees

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have been cut. To recover the FDR of Rs. 1. 54 Lakhs which is pledged to forest department we need to plant 1600 trees.

Institute is presently having seven hostels, five for Boys and two for Girls, which can accommodate only 812 students as per following details:

Presently, Institute is having total intake of about 1400 students. Due to overall shortage of hostel accommodation, almost double the number of students are accommodated in the available hostels, which is a matter of concern for students, parents as well as the Institute Administration. Moreover, the common facilities like number of Toilets, Bathrooms etc. are limited which aggravates the problem further.

There is an urgent and inevitable necessity to hire available hotels in the nearby locality i.e. Srinagar (Garhwal) to create additional hostels for the students. An advertisement was published in the local newspapers on 01/07/2017 and all the hotels, in the radius of about 10 km. from the temporary campus, were extended an invitation to intimate their availability of rooms and willingness to offer their hotel premises for the purpose of leasing it to the Institution to use it as hostel accommodation for the students.

Six hotel owners of Srinagar (Garhwal) submitted their willingness. A duly constituted committee visited the hotels and with due scrutiny and negotiations submitted its reports and recommending 03 hotels for hiring. The proposals of the 03 hotels were sent to the CPWD Office, Srinagar (Garhwal) to access as per authenticated CPWD rates for hiring of hotel building. Only two hotels have given their consent on rent assessed by CPWD. One hotel (Hotel Prachi, Srinagar) has submitted unwillingness to give his hotel premises on rent assessed by CPWD.

Based on the recommended CPWD rates and willingness of the Hotel owners, comparative statement of expenditure of hiring O2 hotels for creating additional student hostel is as under:

MNIT Jaipur is one of the leading best NIT of the country, hence, it is proposed to have collaboration with MNIT Jaipur for implementation of Office Automation Software, Online Recruitment Portal, redesign and hosting of Institute Website, design and development of ERP Solution, and other IT related services through an MoU and having financial quotes for the required services.

# FC 11.07 (D) Administrative and Financial Approval for hiring of buses to provide transportation facility to the hosteller students from hired hotels (hostel) to the Institute and back.

To minimize the shortage of hostel accommodation for students, Institute has hired 02 Hotels at Srikot (Srinagar), at a distance of about 08 Km. from the Institute. It is obligation on the Institute to provide the transport facility to the hosteller students for safer transportation from hired hotels to the Institute and back.

In this regard, an approval has already been taken vide above mentioned Chairman Note, to hire 02 buses per hostel @Rs.30,000 per bus. Quotations have been collected by the committee from the local market to provide the transportation facility to the hostler students. After due scrutiny of the received quotations, Committee recommended M/s. K. S. Ragadwal Tours and Travels, Srinagar (Garhwal) to provide transportation facility from hired hostel to the Institute and back. The details are as under:

After analyzing the above rates, it is observed that the transportation cost of one student for on round is about Rs.23/- which is nearly equivalent to the fare charged by Nagar Nigam buses i.e. Rs.20/- .

In view of the above mentioned facts, to provide the safe and convenient transport facility to the hostler students from hired hotel (Hostel) at Srikot to the Institute and back it is recommended to hire 04 buses @ about Rs.1000 per round per bus i.e about Rs.6,00,000 per month for 04 buses. (Rs.1000 per round x 5 round daily by one bus x 4 buses x 30 days).

The Finance Committee is requested to approve the proposal.
