S.28.03: Regarding approval of seat matrix for the Academic Year 2021-2022 onward.

In compliance to the MHRD letter No. F.No.35-4/2019-TS.III dated 19th June, 2019, the intake of UG students was reduced to 100 for Academic Year 2019-2020 which was later on approved vide resolution of Agenda BoG 22.16 of 22nd BoG dated 22nd June, 2019. However, it was also proposed that the number of students in the institute

during 2020-2021 may be worked out in such a way that the institute is able to provide proper infrastructural and other necessary facilities to the admitted students while ensuring fulfilment of constitutional obligation w.r.t. EWS reservations. A maximum of 800 students vide MHRD Letter No DO F.No. 33-1/2012.TS-III (Annexure S 28.02A) and 1260 students vide MHRD Letter No. F.No.30-3/2019.TS-III (Annexure S 28.02B) can be accommodated in the Srinagar and Sumari campus of NIT Uttarakhand, respectively. S.28.04: To approve the academic Calendar for Odd Semester 2021.

Academic Calendar for Odd Semester - 2021 was prepared after discussions with HoDs and the academic calendar is enclosed as **Annexure S 28.03**. If any deviations from the proposed Academic Calendar or the existing Academic Ordinances due to continuing situations arising from COVID-19 are required then the approval from the Chairman, Senate will be sought in order to smoothly conduct the Academic Activities in Odd semester-2021.

The senate is requested to approve the same for the implementation.

S.28.05: To approve the Draft Ordinance for Online Teaching, Learning and Examinations for Odd Semester - 2021 due to COVID-19 lockdown for all courses and all batches of UG, PG and Ph.D.

Keeping in view the COVID-19 pandemic, the institute is maintaining academic schedules through online/distance/e-learning mode with an aim to avoid any academic loss to the students. Draft of Academic Ordinance for Online Teaching, Learning, and Examinations for Odd Semester - 2021 has been prepared after discussions with HoDs and enclosed as Annexure S 28.04. This special Ordinance is proposed in the interest of the Institute and continuing the education in an unprecedented situation without diluting the teaching, learning and evaluation process and covers all deviation from the established Rules and Ordinances.

In case the COVID-19 subsides, and instructions of MHA, Gol issued subsequently, students may return back in the campus in between the running Semester (i.e. ODD Semester, 2021), the Teaching, Learning and Examinations process shall be resumed in-campus, as per the existing Ordinance.

The Senate is requested to deliberate upon and approve the Draft Ordinance for Online Teaching, Learning, and Examinations for Odd Semester - 2021 due to COVID-19 lockdown for all courses and all batches of UG, PG, and Ph.D.

S.28.06: To deliberate upon the work from home for faculty members after summer vacation (21/04/2021 to 04/06/2021) due to the second wave of COVID19 outbreak.

As per the office order no. NITUK/Estt./2021/00/001/A-52 dated 19/04/2021, the summer vacation of the faculty members was rescheduled from 21/04/2021 to 04/06/2021. Since then, the faculty members are on summer vacation and have to join the institute on 07/06/2021. To avoid academic loss of the students, academic activities scheduled for B.Tech. (2nd, 3rd and 4th Year), M. Tech students (1st and 2nd Year) and Ph.D. scholars (as per academic calendar of Even semester 2021) have been completed. Faculty members are taking classes for 1st year students (as per academic calendar of Even semester 2021) and discharging their administrative & other responsibilities through online mode. By considering the prevailing situation in the Country and state-wise lockdown imposed in different states, faculty members may be allowed to work from home up to 02/07/2021 from where they are residing as of now.
